Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's Day 11

PH 872 Q. Why is the Son of God called "Jesus" meaning "Savior"?

- A. Because he saves us from our sins. Salvation cannot be found in anyone else; it is futile to look for any salvation elsewhere.
- Q. Do those who look for their salvation and security in saints, in themselves, or elsewhere really believe in the only Savior Jesus?
- No. Although they boast of being his, by their deeds they deny the only savior and deliverer, Jesus.

Either Jesus is not a perfect savior, or those who in true faith accept this savior have in him all they need for their salvation.
