### ADULT OPPORTUNITIES

**VERSE-BY-VERSE BIBLE STUDY**: Jim Hassey will be completing his study of the Book of Isaiah in January, and will start a study of Paul's letter to the Galatians in February. Class meets each Sunday at 9:00 a.m. in the Activities Room.
